The Academic and Service Awards Program is the Caucus' signature event, made possible by the many contributions, both in-kind and monetary, from faculty, staff, university administration, parents, and friends. Your support shows up vividly in your ads for this interactive program and brochure and we invite you to support our university, businesses, and contributors that made this celebration possible.

It is our fervent desire that you experience the joy and pride in seeing your students' efforts realized in the re-imagined awards program you'll find between the covers of this brochure. We certainly have. And please, please encourage your returning students to reach out to any one of our Purdue Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff employees. The empirical research evidence for your student reaching out to us is strong and clear, particularly for first-generation students and students of color. "Indeed, *no other factor* plays as strong a role for students of color" who note "faculty interactions encourage them to engage more with learning, try harder, and meet high academic expectations" (Kezar & Maxey, 2014, p. 32). Decreased dropout rates and persistence toward degree completion are among the strongest outcomes of faculty-student interaction (Kezar & Maxey, 2014).

KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Mr. Taylor graduated from Purdue University with a BS in Accounting with Distinction. He is a strong advocate of improving education for minorities and enjoys speaking to students about maximizing opportunities regardless of their surroundings. In 2012 he was awarded the Entrepreneur of the Year Award from Purdue's Krannert School of Management and was the Commencement Speaker for the 226th Purdue University Graduation in August 2015. He remains committed to his alma mater and is Member of the Dean's Advisory Council for the Krannert School of Management.

In 1996, Shawn started his own company, Family EATs Limited Partnership (FELP), and became a Taco Bell franchisee where he acquired, owned, developed, and operated as many as 33 Taco Bell locations in the Houston market. FELP became the largest African-American owned Taco Bell franchise with sales approaching \$30 million and over 500 employees. In 2002, Shawn guided the organization through a financial restructuring process as a result of adverse brand-wide negative publicity that reduced year over year sales 25%, and led the successful turnaround of the business. From 2003 to 2006, FELP's revamped team achieved significant/break-through results without the addition of new restaurants. He increased year over year sales and profitability by 28% and 48% respectively, exceeded all debt covenants annually, and reduced employee turnover while increasing all guest metrics.

After successfully selling FELP in 2007 to take advantage of the demand for Taco Bell franchises, Shawn invested his time in non-profit organizations. In 2011, he became a strategic advisor to Houston Baseball Partners, LLC during their acquisition of the Houston Astros Major League Baseball team and helped with the rebranding of the franchise along with successfully rebuilding relationships with community leaders. Shawn subsequently became a limited partner in the Astros' baseball organization, currently serves on the Board of Trustees for the Astros Foundation, and is the chairman of the Annual Astros Golf Classic. In early 2013, he became a franchisee with Zaxby's Franchise, LLC, and is currently the President and CEO of Zaxby's Houston, LLC, a multi-unit restaurant franchise. Shawn Initially led the acquisition of 3 locations in the Houston market, subsequently identified numerous strategic growth opportunities, and negotiated the largest development agreement in the Franchisor's 25 year history to build 35 new locations in the Houston market.

T H E B L A C K C A U C U S OF F A C U L T Y & S T A F F

The Black Caucus

The Caucus traces its roots to discussions and informal meetings among African American faculty and staff on the Purdue University West Lafayette campus in the Fall of 1970. The concept for an organized group of Black faculty and staff initially was circulated by Dr. Buchanan, who held the position of Coordinator of Black Student Programs at the time. These discussions continued over the next few years until September, 1974, when faculty and staff members responded positively to a proposal from Mr. Sam Hay, Director of Africana Studies and Research Center, to develop a more formal organizational structure. An ad hoc leadership group began planning for the goal with monthly meetings at the old Black Cultural Center.

Under a constitution ratified in December 1974, African American faculty and staff members voted on April 17, 1975 to establish the *Black Faculty and Staff Council of Purdue University*, and elected as its first officers Dr. Luther Williams (Chairperson), Ms. Marion Blalock (Vice Chairperson), Dr. Darlene [Clark-] Hine (Recording Secretary–Treasurer), Mrs. Helen Bass Williams (Corresponding Secretary), Mr. Kenneth McNight (Parliamentarian), Capt. Jerome Adams, Mr. Samuel Hay, and Ms. Phoebe Coleman (Members-at-Large). Purdue President Arthur G. Hansen was duly notified later that month. By the Spring of 1976, the organization became known as the *Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff*.

The basic purpose, goals, and objectives of the Caucus have remained consistent across the life of the organization, and are articulated most clearly in its Constitution and Bylaws (1984):

"The purpose of the Purdue Black Caucus of Faculty and Staff shall be:

- (a) To identify and act upon those issues which affect Black people at Purdue University and the greater Lafayette community, especially as they relate to the function of the University;
- (b) To institute and maintain an effective and positive relationship between the University and its Black constituency both on and off campus;
- (c) To reinforce self-awareness among Black people by implementing programs and activities designed to achieve these aims:
- (d) To gather and disseminate information about available talent, opportunities, and activities that will provide the University with a comprehensive understanding of the dynamics of the Black experience;
- (e) To carry out other activities of a charitable and educational nature to promote the welfare of Black faculty, staff, and students."

From its earliest years, the Caucus undertook monitoring the number and status of African American staff and students at Purdue, providing mutual support, and engaging upper administration in planning for change and advancement on matters of concern. One important, visible, and consistent function has been the Annual Awards Program. Initially begun as an "Academic Support Fund Dance" that raised money for academic merit awards and a possible emergency loan fund, the Caucus distributed 30 "incentive awards" to Black students for the end of the 1975-76 academic year. The Second Annual Academic Support Fund Dance honored 60 outstanding Purdue Undergraduates with cash awards, gifts, and certificated for excellence in scholarship, community service, and leadership. Continuing its tradition of honoring students using only voluntary donations, this 41st Annual Program will honor over 150 undergraduates of African descent at Purdue University.




